CIG & UTAH SOIL HEALTH PARTNERSHIP

Exciting things are happening in year four of this five year project. Five years isn't long enough to observe major changes in soil structure or long-term organic matter buildup, but recent soil tests show early signs of improvement across a variety of operations and landscapes.

Most notably, no yield losses have been reported from using cover crops, soil amendments, or biochar—proving these practices can boost soil health without sacrificing productivity.

UACD REIMBURSED AND REHIRING



UACD received payment for previously denied federal reimbursement requests, and has began rebuilding the capacity lost during the federal funding freeze.

The freeze stopped reimbursement payments for all UACD employees working under federal cooperative agreement, causing nearly all of our employees to be laid off.

UACD worked tirelessly to ensure Utah's federal delegation was aware of the hardship this imposed on Conservation Districts and the need for restored funding.

Two positions have been rehired and we are eagerly awaiting approval to rehire the remaining openings.

We're optimistic that renewed federal support will allow UACD and NRCS to continue working together to deliver conservation to Utah's producers.

2025 ENVIROTHON A DISTRICT SUCCESS

Utah's Conservation Districts contributed \$15,550 this year to support the Utah Envirothon, a statewide environmental competition. Teams from across Utah competed in Richfield, with Logan High School winning and advancing to the international contest in Calgary. At least four district sponsored teams, helping develop Utah's future conservation leaders.
